



Papua New Guinea Group Forges Ahead on Women's Environmental Awareness

Dear Sisters,

We saw a short description of your organization in **The Tribune** February 1993 and are writing for more information about Isis International.

The Melanesian Environment Foundation is a non-government organization working to raise awareness of environmental issues in Papua New Guinea. Our work primarily focusses on the issues of logging, mining and dynamite fishing and is conducted by youth in schools and with people in villages. Over the past year and a half MEF has made a concerted effort to encourage the full participation of women in our work. In our efforts to involve and strengthen the women we have begun to address some basic issues that keep women from work such as violence against women, childcare, health including family planning and feelings of shame, jealousy and fear. These issues have not been totally resolved but have been dealt with significantly so that the women have now begun to participate in the awareness work on environment regularly rather than just office support work.

In our early stages of planning the women's program, we need information from other women's groups like yours that will help to strengthen our understanding of women's relationship with the environment, models to help us develop ways to work with groups of village women and ways to help the men feel less threatened and more supportive. We are interested in receiving your information pack on the environment and what women are doing to protect it and any other publications you may have on the subject...

We realize that we are asking for a lot but please understand that any information you can provide us now or in the future will be greatly appreciated.

Research on Women Migrants in India

Dear Isis,

I am Dr. Kalpana Paralikar, core faculty member of the Women's Studies Department at M.S. University of Baroda. I have been working on women and migration since 1985. I have developed a teaching module on research methodologies for studying women and migration at the household level.

Last year I undertook the study of women migrants from India to the USA addressing issues of concern to planners and policy makers in the two countries. I am also working on a paper on women and migration based on studies in India. Review of available literature indicated a focus on internal migration instead of women migrants from other countries such as Bangladesh and Sri Lanka.

Studies showed that most of the migrants settled in north and south eastern states. However, not much information is available on them and there is a need to study the migrant population and identify facilities provided to them for settlement or transition in their own country.

I would like to know if you have done any projects in this area and see if we can undertake similar ones here. I hope that you will be able to share some information with me.
